From the Editor.....

When we first believed we had heard from God that we should up sticks and move to Maylands the industrial estate looked very different. There were a few little local shops and rows and rows of factories and offices. This was over 25 years ago and some people in the congregation of that time could not believe that God would put us in a place where hardly anyone appeared on a Sunday let alone would come there to worship. But it became gradually obvious that this was what God was saying and after many hiccups and challenges we finally arrived having been encouraged to come by the local council. They want this site to become 'The Heart Of Maylands' with residential areas, shopping, industry and worship taking centre stage. And we can see it happening before our eyes. So, what, then, is our place in this community? Why did God send us here?

Covid shutdowns made our entry into the area virtually invisible. In fact, we have heard many people looking in through the windows and wondering what the building was about. The footfall into the centre is increasing but very slowly and our desire to serve the community in whatever way God intends seems frustratingly stunted at times.

We need to think about reaching out into the community in creative ways because once people do come in and meet us and see the potential here, they sense a special presence and enjoy the experience. In this edition of The Mag, I'd like us to open up our perception of the people and places who live and work in our community; to begin to have a heart for them and to truly take our place here as God has intended.

After many attempts to encourage the builders to use Meet and Eat some of the landscapers came in recently for takeaways. After a couple of days, one chap came in to make a complaint.

We Are All Part Of The Ministry

God has called the whole church to be His people who worship and serve from the Church Centre on the Plaza. In order to do this, we need mega funding, not just to resource our outreach activity but to keep the building going. God has told us that if we do the little things..... regular fundraisers, prayer, volunteering, bringing our creativity into the mix, etc. He will do the big things...... inspiring others to support us.

To this end the elders have been working with a company that specialises in bringing fundraisers to the aid of Christian groups and a 3-year planning strategy has been developed. This plan was circulated to the church members before the Church Meeting in June and needs to be read and discussed in detail before the church can affirm it. Then the process can continue. This discussion will happen at the Church Meeting in July and so it is vital that we all read the plan and come to the meeting. If you have not had the plan or lost it you can ask Admin to email it to you or a printed copy may also be available.

Ask for a copy of the Future Kraft Outcomes Plan.

A copy of the plan would have been useful here but it did not fit into the Mag format.

It is so important that we all take on this responsibility to read and discuss the plan and to set up our own fundraising activities. In so doing we will develop our outreach into the community and release the means to fulfil those aims.

These two cheerful guys were very helpful when I asked permission to take photos. They already know about AFC since Heather created a link between them and DENS. Once a week leftover food from that day is collected from them and taken to DENS as part of the evening meal. They were so happy to donate to this cause. It was not good for me to stand inside their shop. The food looks amazing. It took all of my willpower to come out empty handed.

GREGGS

I went from one form of torture to another as I stepped into Greggs. Doughnuts, bacon rolls, cookies, sausage rolls were only some of the temptations that surrounded me. There was a long queue for coffee and snacks and I took my place. [No I didn't succumb.] As I stood there I was pleased to reflect that these two food takeaway shops standing next to each other do not seem to be suffering from the proximity of their neighbour. The lady I spoke to did not have the authority to say whether or not I could take photos and I stressed to her my desire not to cause a problem as I told her about the church being a neighbour and that we would be talking about the shops in our June edition of The Mag. She was happy that we care about our neighbours on the Plaza.

TESCO

I couldn't find anyone free in Tesco to ask about photos so I just decided to be thankful that they are there and move on. I have used this store on several occasions for goods and to use the card machine and it has been a Godsend.

BARBER'S WORKSHOP This business stands directly opposite Meet and Eat. It was full of customers and the young woman working

nearest the door was happy to hear that we are thinking about them and gave me permission to take photos. A couple of years ago I remember seeing them putting chairs outside the shop for people waiting so that they complied with the covid regulations being set out. They have worked incredibly hard to get their business up and running as have all the shops.

STUDIO by OPEN Next to the Barber's Workshop is another Hairdressing establishment. The manager jumped at the opportunity to find my appointment. When I explained I didn't have one she smiled as she said 'So you'd like me to book you one?' Even when I told her I was not going to be a customer today she was very smiley and seemed very pleased to be included in our June Magazine. Another business doing very well this morning as every seat was occupied.

RELAXING ON THE PLAZA Just recently the completion of the landscaping to the centre of the Plaza was completed with shrubs, plants, trees and seating [you may need a cushion] it will be a good place to take

a little break. Maybe get a coffee and cake from Meet and Eat and sit outside as the landscaping goes right past our doors. It was one of these landscapers who came in with the complaint.

One of the things we have noticed ever since we arrived is that the Plaza can be windy and the wind seems to particularly like whipping through the waste bins. I noticed a heap of



rubbish in and around

the bins by Starbucks and here on the Plaza, on a Monday morning evidence of population during the weekend was present. It is Hightown's responsibility to keep the place tidy and they do send bin men but perhaps now we will be having the new flats populated soon, more bins and more frequent collections will be

needed. I chased this plastic bag, passing food wrappers, bits of paper and tickets as it blew across our cobbles. These also blow down into the lower car park and end up in the church garden. If you see any rubbish in the garden and you can remove it we will be so grateful.

NEW NEIGHBOURS The builders are just finishing their efforts on



the estate that was on the other side of the hoarding for months and months but is now an integral part of the view. We can now walk through from the church centre into the extension of the housing estate to see how many new neighbours we can expect. We think there may be three new shops as well as the flats and houses. There appear to be seats and pleasant walkways with a road that services all parts of the estate. And AFCC is now not at the far end but right in the middle.

It was with great sadness that we heard of the death of the little girl who lived in one of the new flats. It was a terrible tragedy and one which shocked neighbours and those working in the vacinity. How can we make a difference to these neighbours. Can we help to bring peace to the area? Surely there must be something. A candlelight vigil service has been suggested. We must do something.
